
REPORT

Most notably, our grant program provided over \$191,000 in 2020 toward projects and programs that better our communities, including a \$15,000 grant to the Middle Michigan Economic Development Corporation to support the Michigan Small Business Relief Program through the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC). The Michigan Small Business Relief Program is designed to support businesses most impacted by the COVID-19 outbreak.

NEW IN 2020: The Jamie A. Blow Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (Stem) Endowed Scholarship Fund

This new scholarship is one of over 45 held at Clare County Community Foundation. Annually, the Community Foundation awards over \$40,000 in scholarships.

A new scholarship opportunity is available for female students attending high school in Clare County intending to attend post-secondary to pursue a career in science, technology, engineering, or math. The **Jamie A. Blow Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Endowed Scholarship Fund** was established at the Clare County Community Foundation in 2020 and offered for the first time in the spring of 2021.

It is estimated American companies will seek to fill 3.5 million STEM jobs by 2025, with more than 2 million left unfilled due to a skills shortage. Women make up 28% of these roles but they could significantly contribute to closing the skills gap if more women pursue STEM careers. Experts cite a combination of culture and means for pursuing STEM education as some of the reasons for the gender gap. Therefore Colonel (COL) Jamie A. Blow, the scholarship founder, created the new scholarship. She is no stranger to being the only woman in the room. COL Blow is one of only three female entomologists to attain the rank of COL and the first woman to lead Department of Defense Pest Management.

"I created the scholarship fund to create opportunities for young women who have interests in science and technology but without the means or direction to pursue it," said COL Blow. "Pursuing opportunities may not be easy and you will probably need to make sacrifices to get there but life is a journey not a destination. Young people need to know there are opportunities all around them if they are willing to pursue them.

COL Blow's legacy will continue indefinitely through the scholarship. To learn ways to support a student by starting your own fund or contributing to The Jamie A. Preference for the scholarship recipient is given to but is not exclusive to applicants that have overcome challenges, have financial need, and have shown the potential to succeed in post-secondary education. Youth Action Council & Teacher Mini Grants

The Clare County Youth Action Council (YAC) is a group of local youth who are giving back to the community through service, leadership, and philanthropy. Any youth aged 12 to 19 who is either living in or attending middle school or high school in Clare County is eligible to join. The studentled group has a grant budget and meets regularly to decide which projects impacting students in Clare County they will fund.

As part of the Clare County Community Foundation's continued efforts to grow with the community and offer support where it's needed, the Teacher Mini Grant Program was established in 2018. These grants of up to \$250 can go toward any project or program that positively impacts or enhances learning for local students. Any teacher can apply throughout the school year.



Fund Types:

Project Funds: Funds held at the Foundation for various projects, groups, and organizations in the area. They provide an important opportunity for the Community Foundation to offer service and leadership to the community. These funds present large variations in size, activity level, structure, and longevity.

Agency Funds: An Agency Fund is established by a nonprofit that transfers certain assets to the Community Foundation and designates itself as the beneficiary of the fund.

Designated Funds: Designated Funds are established by individual donors (third parties), not the agency itself, to benefit one or more nonprofit organizations.

Donor Advised Funds: A Donor Advised Fund (DAF) is a type of charitable giving fund that is established by a donor with an eligible charitable sponsoring organization (i.e. the Community Foundation) to support a cause (or causes) that the donor cares about.

Field of Interest Funds: Field of Interest Funds allow your gift to make a massive impact in the causes you are most passionate about. By establishing a Field of Interest Fund, you can target your gift to address needs in an important area of community life.

Scholarship Funds: A scholarship fund lets you help deserving students further their education.

Community Investment Funds: Meets everchanging community needs. When you establish a Community Investment Fund, you can address a broad range of local needs, including future needs that often cannot be anticipated today. Clare County Community Foundation
